1. Course Number: EMS 210

Course Title: Paramedic Clinical Experiences

2. Description: Clinical rotations provide opportunities for observation and practice of procedures, skills, and experiences. Skills and procedures in the clinical rotations are completed while working with preceptors in a variety of clinical settings including hospitals, urgent care centers, and other health care settings. The experiences and skills attained by the student are based upon specific skill requirements and specific hours spent in rotation.

3. Student Learning Outcomes (instructional objectives: intellectual skills):

Upon successful completion of this course, students perform the following with supervision:

- Patient Assessment; Patient charting and documentation
- Intravenous Access and Phlebotomy; Intravenous therapy and IV fluid therapy management
- Airway management; oxygenation; ventilation
- Medication administration (IV, IM, SC PO and Inhalation)
- IV Infusion Medications
- Management of acutely ill adult, trauma and medical patients
- Management of acutely ill pediatric, trauma and medical patients
- Management of cardiac STEMI Patients
- Management of STROKE patients

8. Suggested General Guidelines for Evaluation:

- Students are expected to complete paper records that accurately record all hours, skills/ procedures and experiences that occur in the clinical environment (Clinical Rotation Matrix)
- Clinical hours and procedures are tracked using the FSDAP scheduler. This system allows for monitoring of student progress and skill competencies.
- Clinical performance data sheets, FSDAP information and clinical competency/ completion is reviewed with the student in an interview and assessment following the clinical rotations.
